1. What do you think are the characteristics of a great board member?

Number one the Board member has to be a team player. The members should act in a civil manner toward each other. The Board members should allow everyone to participate and express their opinions on Board issues. Once the Board makes a decision all Board members should support the decision. If the decision is opposite their vote, the Board member has a right to request reconsideration of the vote. No Board member should make statements outside the meeting against the Board decision. When the Board meets in executive session on issues such as legal or contracts, they must keep the information confidential until the point in time the Board has agreed to act on the matter or the Board decides the information can be shared with the members. Board member's must understand the By Laws of GVR and the procedures which a Board transacts business such as Roberts Rules of Order. The Board should understand the purpose and value of the GVR Foundation. It is important the Board understands the role of the Board versus the role of management.

2. What do you see as the Board's challenges?

To have the Board work together for the betterment of all GVR members. We should not allow a small majority force issues that harm the ability of GVR to maintain our great facilities and programs. We should expect management to monitor all the facilities and programs to assure they are cost efficient and serve the best interest of our members.
